Ex: Right to a fair trial










THE BILL OF RIGHTS

- Freedom of Religion
- Freedom of <u>Assembly</u>
- Freedom of <u>Press</u>
- Freedom of <u>Petition</u>
- Freedom of <u>Speech</u>
 - Freedom of Speech can be <u>limited</u> if a "clear & present <u>danger</u>" is created.





- Right to bear arms
- Right to carry your own weapon



Right to Bear Arms



 Prohibits the quartering of troops in people's <u>homes</u> during <u>peace</u> time.



4th Amendment


- Protects from unreasonable searches
 - A Search warrant must be issued



- Due Process of Law
- Grand <u>Jury</u> Indictment
- Double <u>Jeopardy</u>: Cannot be tried <u>twice</u> for the <u>same</u> crime.
- No <u>self-incrimination</u>: You can <u>refuse</u> to <u>testify</u> against yourself.
- Eminent <u>Domain</u>: <u>Property</u>
 cannot be taken <u>away</u>
 unless it benefits <u>society</u>.



Due Process



- The Right to a speedy public trial in criminal cases
- Right to a lawyer or attorney
- Right to confront witnesses





Right to trial in civil cases with jury. (Money) Civil Cases such as law suits.



No <u>cruel</u> or <u>unusual</u> punishment No unreasonably <u>high fines or bail</u>






9th Amendment

Rights of the <u>people</u> are not <u>limited</u> to the first <u>10</u> amendments

10th Amendment

Powers not mentioned are <u>reserved</u> to the <u>States</u>.

This is the idea of Federalism
