

#### **Texas Constitution**

- The Texas Constitution is the <u>highest</u> law in our <u>state</u>, it is subject only to the <u>U.S.</u>
   Constitution & federal laws.
- The current Texas Constitution went into effect in <u>1876</u>
- Texas has had a total of <u>7</u> constitutions dating back to 1827.
