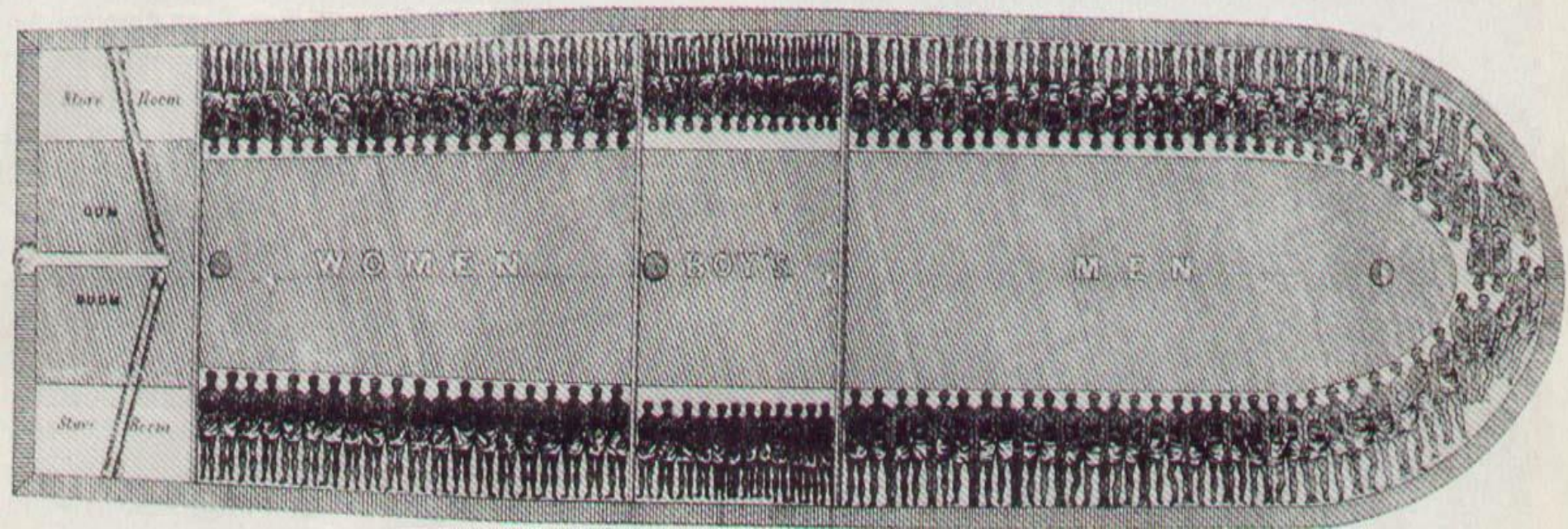
The Transatlantic Slave Trade



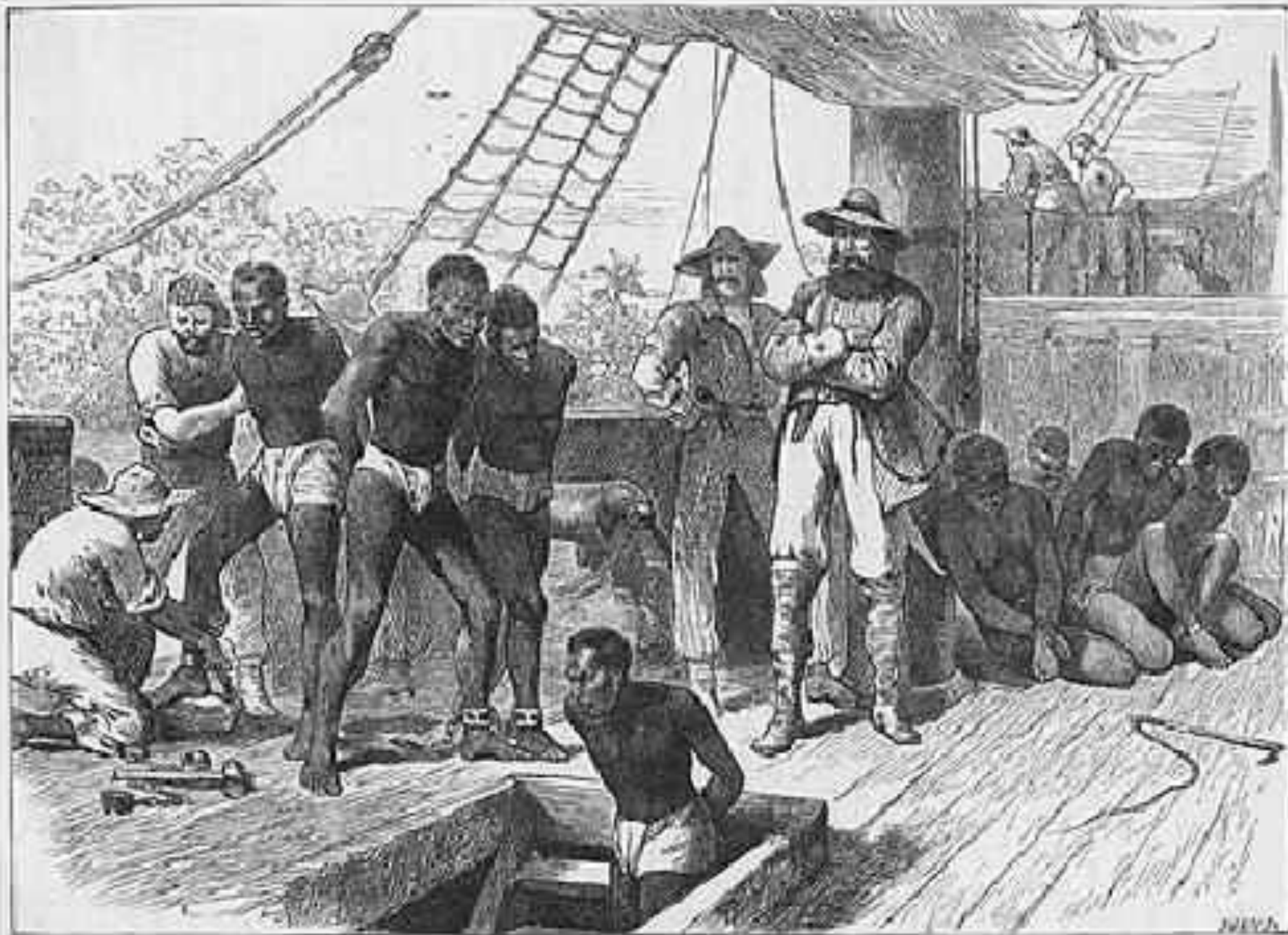

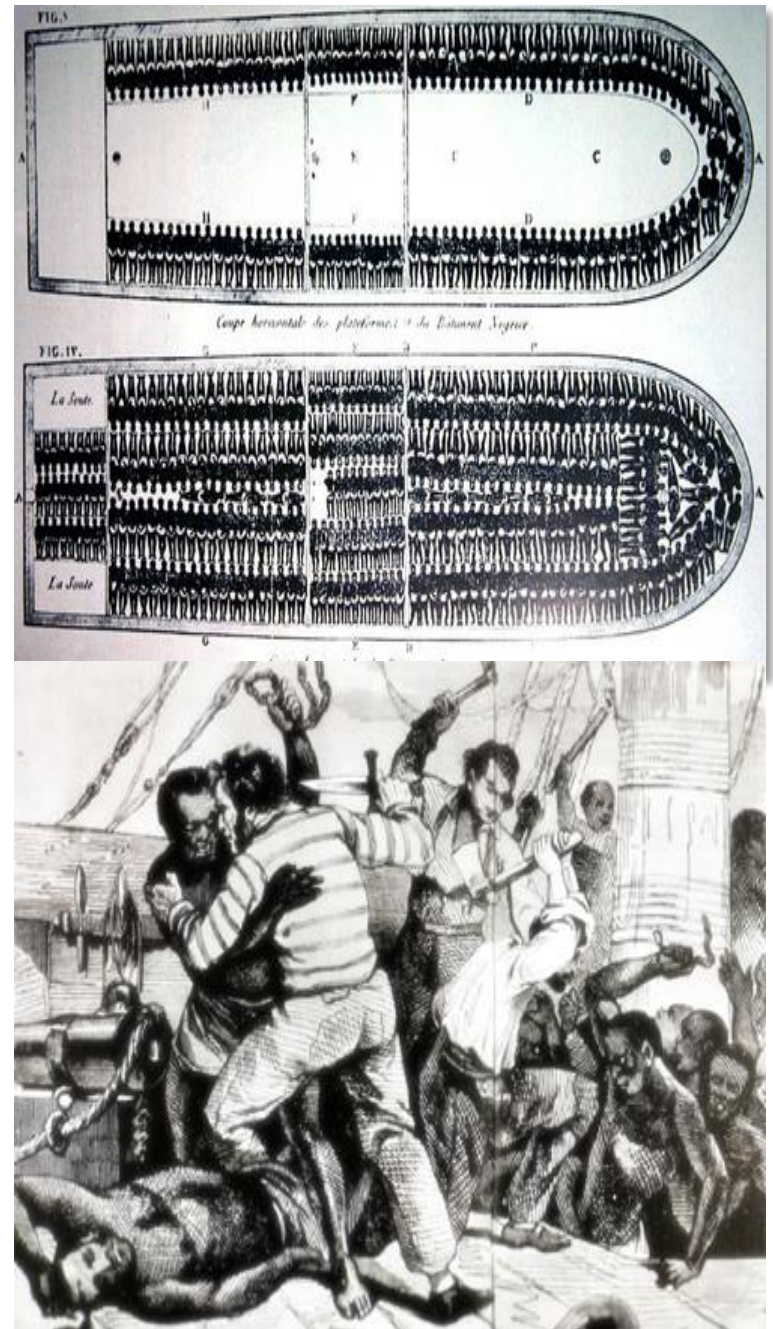

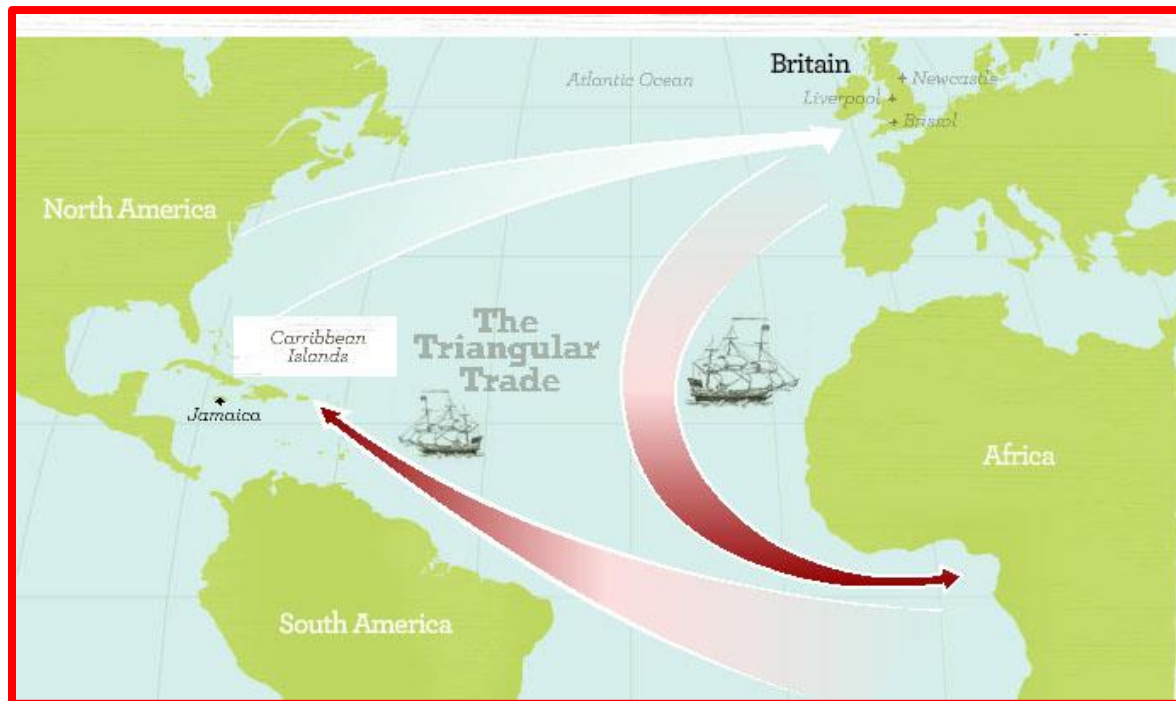
Triangular Trade & Middle Passage

- ❖ Refers to the constant trade between Colonies, England, & Africa for slaves & other commodities.

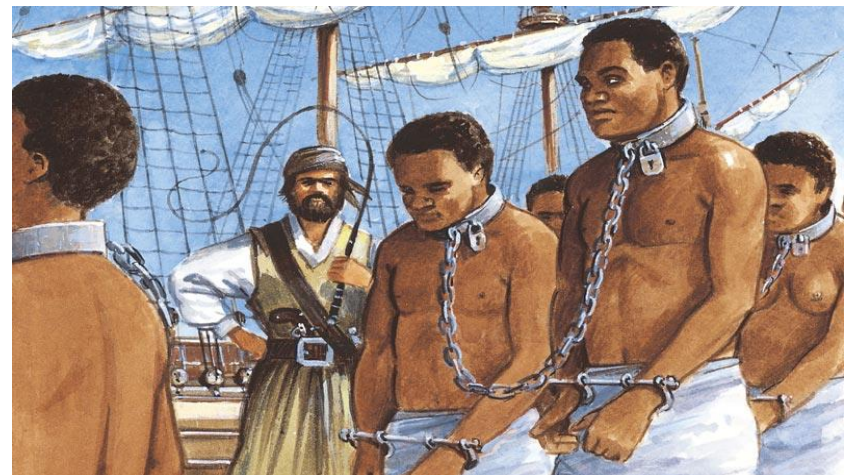
Middle Passage:
